Ms Nontembeko Nduna testified on 28 January 2014 that she lives in a shack in CT section in the Taiwan informal settlement in Site C, without water or street lights and that she has to walk for 10 to 15 minutes to the communal toilets, which close at 7 pm. After they close she has to relieve herself in a dark area without lights, using her cell-phone to guide her (pages 555 – 7 of the transcript), exposing her to the risk of rape or robbery.

8. Mr Gavin Silber states in paragraphs 69 - 70 of his affidavit that Khayelitsha has the highest pedestrian mortality rate in the City (Bundle 1(5), File D, Organisational Statements), vehicles tend to speed in Khayelitsha and that traffic police are seldom seen patrolling in the area.
- 8.1 How many traffic officers are employed by the City?

- 8.2 On what basis are traffic officers assigned to work in different areas in the City?
- 8.3 What proportion of the City's traffic officers are deployed in Khayelitsha?
- 8.4 In 2013, on how many occasions were traffic officers deployed in Khayelitsha between the hours of 18.00 and 6.00 am?
- 8.5 What plans, if any, does the City have to install traffic lights or speed bumps in Khayelitsha?

9. What is the relationship between the anti-land invasion unit within the Law Enforcement Department and the anti-land invasion unit within the Housing Directorate in the Housing Department headed by Mr Stephen Hayward?
- 9.1 Are these different units and, if so, how do their functions differ?
- 9.2 To what extent are the officials in Mr Hayward's department accountable to Mr Bosman?

10. How many crime and disorder hotspots were identified by the City in 2013?
11. Were any of these hotspots in Khayelitsha and, if so, where were they?

12. Were any of these hotspots in informal settlements and, if so, where were they?

13. Why are CCTV cameras situated at only three stations in Khayelitsha? On what basis were these stations selected?
14. How many crimes or incidents recorded on the cameras have been reported to SAPS since the cameras were installed? How many convictions have resulted from these reports?

15. On what basis are the 550 operational Metro Police officers allocated between the various policing precincts in the City?
16. How many of the 550 operational Metro Police officers are assigned to work in Khayelitsha?

17. On what basis are the approximately 800 law enforcement officers allocated between the various policing precincts in the City?
18. How many of the approximately 800 law enforcement officers are assigned to work in Khayelitsha?

19. How often does the City repair street and high-mast lighting?
20. How does the City establish that lights are not working?
21. What procedure is followed to respond to reports that lights are not working and what are the average response times for street and high-mast lighting respectively?

Professor Simkins testified (27 January 2014, transcript p 354) that the annual population growth rate for Khayelitsha of 1.9% is not unduly high and should not place undue stress on resource provision. What are the planning challenges that the City faces as a result of the flow of new residents to Khayelitsha?

23. Dr Josias testified on 29 January 2014 that a serial rapist operated by luring children into a bushy area in Endlovini and that the City did not clear this bushy area, despite being requested to do so.
 - 23.1 Is it correct that the City did not clear the bushy area concerned, despite being requested to do so? If so, why did it fail to clear the area?
 - 23.2 Was this bushy area identified as a crime hotspot? If not, why not?
 - 23.3 Did the City patrol the bushy area or erect surveillance cameras to deter the serial rapist? If not, why not?

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
